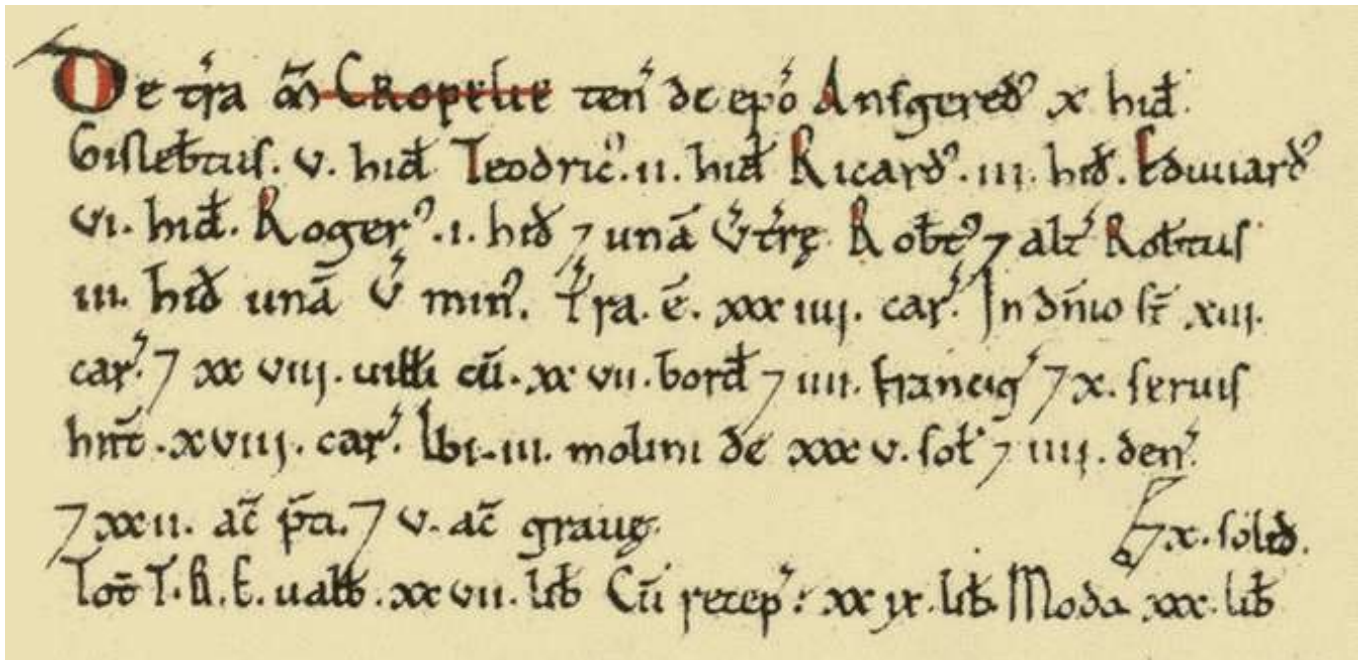


ENTRY FOR CROPREDY IN DOMESDAY BOOK

TRANSCRIPT OF ABOVE ENTRY –

Of the land of the manor of Cropredy, Ansgered holds of the bishop 10 hides; Gilbert, 5 hides; Theodric, 2 hides; Richard, 3 hides; Edward, 6 hides; Roger, 1 hide and 1 virgate of land; Robert and another Robert, 3 hides, less 1 virgate. There is land for 34 ploughs. In demesne are 13 ploughs; and 28 villeins with 27 bordars and 4 Frenchmen and 10 slaves have 18 ploughs. There are 3 mills rendering 35s 4d, and 22 acres of meadow and 5 acres of a grove. The whole TRE was worth £27 ; when received, £29; now £30 10s.

TRE = Tempore Regis Edwardi (in the time of King Edward)

CROPREDY MANOR IN 1068

Lords of the Manor:

Total land = 50 hides

Tenant in chief : Remigius de Fécamp, Bishop of Lincoln 25 hides

Ansgered of Waterville holds of the bishop - 10 hides

Edward - 6 hides

Gilbert - 5 hides

Richard of Newark - 3 hides

Robert d'Oilly - 3 hides less 1 virgate

Robert son of Walkelin - 3 hides less 1 virgate

Theodric - 2 hides

Roger of Ivry - 1 hide and 1 virgate

Villagers:

28 villeins

27 bordars

10 slaves

4 Frenchmen

These numbers indicate families rather than individuals

Land:

Land for 34 ploughs - 13 lord's plough teams

- 18 men's plough teams

22 acres of meadow

5 acres of woodland

3 mills

'Plough' = a plough team of 8 oxen and the plough itself

Value of Cropredy Manor to the lord in 1066 - £27

and in 1086 - £30.5s
