## TRANSCRIPT OF ABOVE ENTRY -

Of the land of the manor of Cropredy, Ansgered holds of the bishop 10 hides; Gilbert, 5 hides; Theodric, 2 hides; Richard, 3 hides: Edward, 6 hides; Roger, 1 hide and 1 virgate of land; Robert and another Robert, 3 hides, less 1 virgate. There is land for 34 ploughs. In demesne are 13 ploughs; and 28 villeins with 27 bordars and 4 Frenchmen and 10 slaves have 18 ploughs. There are 3 mills rendering 35s 4d, and 22 acres of meadow and 5 acres of a grove. The whole TRE was worth £27; when received, £29; now £30 10s.

*TRE* = *Tempore Regis Edwardi* (*in the time of King Edward*)
